II. FACULTY DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES

- **Quality Matters: to date 91 faculty (including Institute for Black Catholic Studies)** have registered for and/or taken the introductory course and have expressed an interest in continuing professional development in this area
- **Grant activity**
 - Work has already begun on the mentoring component of the BUILD grant. In the near future, we will develop an online course for faculty mentors from other institutions.
 - CAT has also applied for the \$1.3million NSF Cyberlearning grant.
 - Karen Nichols submitted a concept paper to the Teagle Foundation which would provide continuing training for online/hybrid instructors.
