## INLINE ELEMENTS

### PHRASE ELEMENTS

<i>emphasis</i>	<code>&lt;EM&gt;emphasis&lt;/EM&gt;</code>
<b>strong emphasis</b>	<code>&lt;STRONG&gt;strong emphasis&lt;/STRONG&gt;</code>
<i>citation</i>	<code>&lt;CITE&gt;citation&lt;/CITE&gt;</code>

### FONTSTYLE ELEMENTS

<b>bold</b>	<code>&lt;B&gt;bold&lt;/B&gt;</code>
<i>italic</i>	<code>&lt;I&gt;italic&lt;/I&gt;</code>
smaller	<code>&lt;SMALL&gt;smaller&lt;/SMALL&gt;</code>
bigger	<code>&lt;BIG&gt;bigger&lt;/BIG&gt;</code>

### SUB AND SUPERScript

superscript <sup>123</sup>	<code>&lt;SUP&gt;123&lt;/SUP&gt;</code>
subscript <sub>456</sub>	<code>&lt;SUB&gt;456&lt;/SUB&gt;</code>

### EMPTY CONTENT

line break	<code>&lt;BR&gt;</code>
image	<code>&lt;IMG SRC="somepic.gif" ALT="photo"&gt;</code>

### ANCHORS

<u>link</u>	<code>&lt;A HREF="somepage.html"&gt;link&lt;/A&gt;</code>
target	<code>&lt;A HREF="something"&gt;target&lt;/A&gt;</code>

Note: Block-level elements begin on new lines, whereas inline (or text-level) elements do not. Another way of thinking about the distinction is that block elements create larger structures than inline elements.

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## GLOBAL STRUCTURE

### VERSION INFO

Contains information about the version of HTML being used, such as:

```
<!DOCTYPE HTML PUBLIC "-//W3C//DTD HTML 4.0//EN"
"http://www.w3.org/TR/REC-html40/strict.dtd">
```

### HTML

The HTML element is merely a wrapper or container for the head and body of the document.

### HEAD

`<HEAD>`

Contains information about the document, such as the title, as well as other more abstruse stuff.

### BODY

`<BODY>`

The actual contents of the document are located here, in the body.

The contents of an HTML document are defined in terms of blocks.
